LETTER FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Spotlight On Impact



In September of 2023, I began my role as Executive Director of the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (LVMPD) Foundation. I am a nonprofit leader who does not crave the "spotlight"; rather I want to utilize my skills to make meaningful impact in our community. That is the reason for the theme of this annual impact report centering around "spotlights" and highlighting a few examples of our impact.

Law enforcement officers use their spotlights to improve visibility and signify their presence in an area. Sometimes the use of a spotlight might cause a reasonable person to feel they are the object of official scrutiny. When I began my role with the LVMPD Foundation, I was intentional about improving our own visibility to ensure we were making the most meaningful impacts possible in our greater Las Vegas area. Through our efforts of scrutinizing all of the various programs, events and initiatives that the IVMPD Foundation was offering and supporting, we found so many reasons to celebrate. And by keeping the spotlight on deepening our impact, of course, we also found opportunities for improvement and for the creation of new compelling programs and initiatives.

We celebrated the creation of our new Hispanic Giving Circle, a campaign that enables us to improve the lives of our local Latino families and strengthen their trust in law enforcement. The Hispanic Giving Circle facilitates programs and initiatives that celebrate their heritage and their contributions to our community. Through the flagship community engagement events, we served more than 109,000 people in 2023, spotlighting the partnership between LVMPD Foundation, the Office of Community Engagement, and the Community Oriented Policing teams at the Area Commands.

The various initiatives throughout 2023 to commemorate the 50th anniversary of LVMPD due to the merger of Las Vegas Police Department and Clark County Sheriff's Department in 1973 reminded our community of the rich history of the department.

I am inspired by so many people connected to the LVMPD Foundation – donors, community partners, the families and youth we serve through our programs, and of course LVMPD Sheriff Kevin McMahill and the incredible LVMPD organization – all of whom make possible our success.

Our most vulnerable neighborhoods continue to face barriers and disparities to access what most of us take for granted. The LVMPD Foundation will focus our spotlight on making meaningful community impact through supporting and fostering community relationships with local law enforcement. Dollar Loan Center





On a sunny Fall day, Las Vegas short-term lender Dollar Loan Center demonstrated a strong commitment to public safety by pledging a \$250,000 contribution to the Las Vegas Metro Police Department Foundation. Simulating settings such as gas stations, convenience stores, learning centers, casinos, hotel rooms, and retail outlets allows officers to practice handling emergencies, addressing potential criminal activities, and resolving conflicts for optimal outcomes.

Training Excellence at JETI



On the morning of December 6, 2023, South Central Area Command Officers Jacob Noriega and Ty Vesperas were among the first responders to reports of gunfire at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV).

Upon arriving at Beam Hall, Officers Noriega and Vesperas encountered a shooting victim emerging from the building, bleeding and in need of immediate medical assistance.

The area was not secure for medical units to access, so Officers Noriega and Vesperas administered emergency medical assistance and placed a tourniquet on the shooting victim, a technique they learned at the LVMPD Joint Emergency Training Institute (JETI).

The officers then put the shooting victim in the trunk of their patrol vehicle, with Officer Noriega climbing into the trunk with the shooting victim as Officer Vesperas drove to a safe location to meet medical units. There, officers found a gunshot wound to the victim's chest. Officers Noriega and Vesperas took turns applying pressure to the victim's chest wound until paramedics arrived.

Despite the tragic loss of three lives during the incident, the heroic actions of Officers

Noriega and Vesperas ensured the survival of the fourth victim. Their composure under pressure and unwavering commitment to the safety and well-being of the community epitomize the qualities of exemplary law enforcement officers and are an example of the critical importance of welltrained officers.

Through Sheriff Kevin McMahill's leadership, the JETI is a cornerstone of officer and first responder preparedness, offering comprehensive programs tailored to address the complexities of modern-day threats, including mass casualty events.

The comprehensive medical training curriculum completed by thousands of LVMPD Officers like Officers Noriega and Vesperas, including "Stop the Bleed" training, was conducted at the JETI and was facilitated by faculty from Touro University Nevada and made possible by funding support from the Engelstad Foundation.

Moving forward, we remain steadfast in our commitment to providing innovative and comprehensive training opportunities at the JETI, empowering officers to respond effectively to any situation they may encounter on our streets.



Joint Emergency Training Institute (JETI)





The Joint Emergency Training Institute (JETI) offers a comprehensive infrastructure to prepare law enforcement and other first responders to handle public safety challenges confidently, competently, and professionally. Through hands-on practice and feedback from instructors, trainees develop critical thinking abilities, decision-making skills, and teamwork dynamics essential for effective emergency response while encountering scenarios ranging from routine patrols and traffic stops to high-stakes crisis situations.

Reality Based Training Center includes Classrooms, Mat Rooms and Simulated Technology Room.

Indoor Tactical Training Village will offer 110,000 square feet of training space where law enforcement officers and other first responders are actively involved in role-playing exercises and scenario-based drills, where they must apply their skills, knowledge, and judgment to address evolving situations.




