Together for the Greater Good

When LVMPD Spring Valley officers Humberto Zarate and Oscar Murguia learned about a family living in fear of gang violence, they knew they had to take immediate action. Without hesitation, officers Zarate and Murguia stepped in, and **in just two days** and collaborating with several agencies, their efforts relocated the family to a safer environment, giving them the protection and hope they desperately needed.

This powerful act of kindness is one of many celebrated through the LVMPD Foundation's **Good Ticket program**, which honors officers and personnel who show compassion and kindness in policing. The program, made possible by a partnership with **Resorts World Las Vegas**, is an opportunity to connect with and strengthen community trust.









Together for Safety

K9 Enzo's story is a powerful reminder of the risks law enforcement officers face every day. During a suspect's apprehension, Enzo was stabbed. But thanks to the swift response of the LVMPD Air Support team, he was airlifted to emergency veterinary care and made a full recovery. This chilling incident underscores the invaluable work of Metro's Air Support and Search & Rescue units, whose lifesaving efforts extend throughout Clark County.

The **Hidden Heroes Black & White Gala** honors the officers and personnel whose quiet, behind-the-scenes contributions impact countless lives.

On April 12, 2024, at Palms Casino Resort, the gala event spotlighted the critical work of the Air Support and Search & Rescue teams, recognizing their lifesaving efforts in incidents like Enzo's.

Created by Foundation board member, **Nami Oneda**, and **The Gratitude Project**, the Hidden Heroes Gala honors those whose dedication often goes unnoticed. Inspired by the heroism of "1 October" in 2017, Nami launched the event to ensure these individuals receive the recognition they deserve, making it a cornerstone of our community engagement and fundraising efforts.

Beaming with pride, Nami reflected, "The Hidden Heroes Black & White Gala celebrates some of the best of Metro whose contributions and presence may be largely unnoticed by the larger community, but whose selflessness and dedication make our local law enforcement agency the best in the nation."



Together for Thriving Neighborhoods

As a young, unhoused teen, Jordan was in a place that didn't offer much hope. But in 2024, she stood before an audience of 250 female officers and community leaders at the **Wonder Women of Metro Luncheon** to share her journey and accomplishments while participating in the DREAM Program (Discover, Redirect, Empower, Advocate & Mentor). At one point, she admitted, "I can't believe I have the personal cellphone numbers of so many officers." It was a profound moment — Jordan realized she wasn't just another statistic. She had support. She had a community behind her. And for the first time in her life, she believed in herself.





This is the power of connection, and it's how Metro's community engagement initiatives are helping to build thriving, resilient neighborhoods across Southern Nevada. In 2024, the LVMPD Foundation partnered with the Office of Community Engagement (OCE) to strengthen underserved and at-risk communities. Together, we are helping youth like Jordan find their voice, confidence and a future full of possibilities.




Together for Safer Streets

DREAM Program **500**students graduated

This mentorship program, DREAM (Discover, Redirect, Empower, Advocate Mentor), empowers high-risk youth with guidance, advocacy and a path to a brighter future.



LIMA **299** participants served

LIMA (Law Enforcement Intervention for Mental Health and Addiction) addresses mental health, addiction and homelessness with direct support and outreach to create stronger, healthier communities.



total officer trainings completed

Approximately 3,000 officers from LVMPD and outside jurisdiction (OJ) partners, most of whom completed an average of three training sessions. Training Programs: Officers attended Advanced Officer Skills Training (AOST); Multi-Assault, Counter Terrorism Action Capabilities (MACTAC); and Reality-based Training (RBT) to enhance tactical and decision-making skills, including de-escalation tactics.

Honoring his remarkable contributions, we proudly unveiled the naming of the **Detective Steve Scholl Building** for the Tactical Training Village at the Joint Emergency Training Institute (JETI).

JETI is no ordinary facility — **it's a lifeline**. Designed to prepare first responders for the most dangerous and complex threats, this state-of-the-art training center equips law enforcement with the precision, the expertise and staying calm under pressure to save lives. Every drill, every simulated crisis and every moment of preparation has one purpose: to protect and preserve our community in the face of unpredictable challenges, from acts of violence to natural disasters.

The Tactical Training Village represents a monumental step forward in public safety. This immersive facility will prepare law enforcement and other first responders to face the unimaginable – from active shooter incidents to advanced de-escalation scenarios – ensuring they are always ready when seconds count.

It's not just a training site; **it's a cornerstone for building a safer future.**

This ambitious project has only been possible through the unwavering support of community leaders, organizations and donors who share this vision of a safer tomorrow. As we near completion of the second phase of construction, your contribution can make a lasting difference for the impactful multijurisdictional training programs that take place at the JETI.
